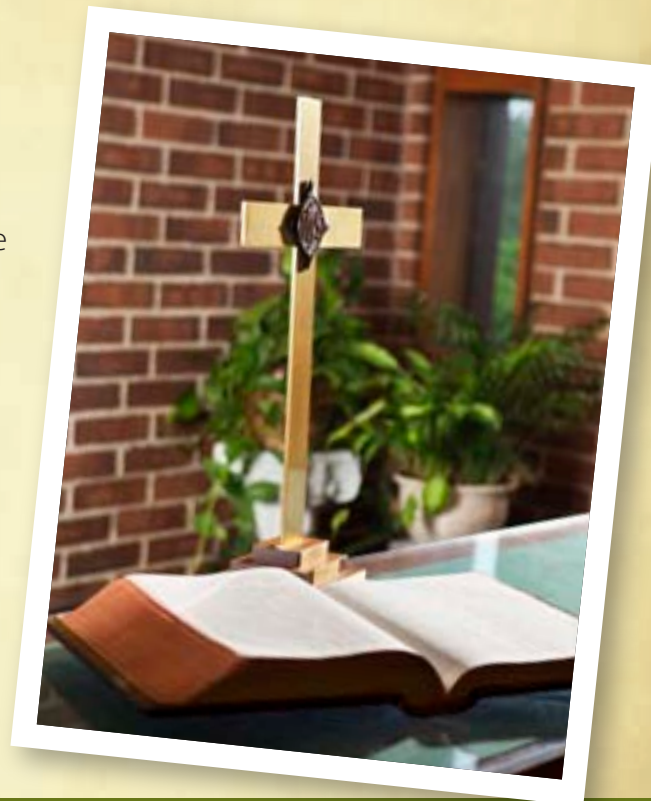


Bishop Milo Loppnow Spiritual Life Fund Marks One-Year Anniversary

Giving From Your IRA

Did you know you can make a gift directly to the Marquardt Foundation from your IRA and it will not be considered taxable income?

The IRA Charitable Rollover Provision allows people aged 70½ and older to donate a portion of their required minimum distribution (RMD) to a charity of their choice. All gifts must be made by December 31, 2011.

For your gift to qualify for IRA Rollover benefits, direct your IRA manager to transfer funds from your traditional or Roth IRA directly to the charity of your choice. The charity must be a tax-exempt organization that can accept donations, such as the Marquardt Foundation. There is no minimum requirement, but the maximum is \$100,000 per person annually.

A gift to the Marquardt Foundation is a meaningful way to offer support for the services provided to seniors within Marquardt Village and in the greater Watertown community. **For more information, contact your financial advisor or Marquardt Foundation staff at (920) 206-4000.**

PRESERVING THE PAST... embracing the future

Thirty years ago, the vision of building a chapel on the Marquardt Village campus became a reality because of the persistence and dedication of Bishop Milo Loppnow and other inspired individuals.

The chapel at Marquardt began humbly enough. It was a simple space in the newly built Bethany Center that made the mission of Marquardt Village possible: to care for the elderly and handicapped in a Christian environment. As Christian furnishings were added, the area was transformed into an even more sacred place.

Today the chapel in Bethany Center is used for a variety of purposes, with staff ever mindful that it is still predominantly a place of worship. For residents who can not get to the chapel, services are broadcast to rooms and apartments with the help

of a video camera and sound system. More than half the residents at Marquardt Manor, our Health and Rehabilitation Center, "attend" either in person or by television. Even more residents watch from their homes in Hus, Mueller, Anna Nitschmann and Milo Loppnow apartment buildings and Zinzendorf Hall.

"Pastor Rick's services are vital," said Mary Moldenhauer, Activity Director at Marquardt Manor. Rev. Dr. Rick Brewer, Marquardt's Pastoral Care Director, leads worship in the chapel at two services every Sunday morning. Pastors of the Clergy Roundtable (including local pastors) share the responsibility of holding services every Tuesday, leading Christian worship for all residents. Catholic mass and WELS services are held weekly.

Lynne Wagner, Director of Nursing at Marquardt Manor, recounted a story of a woman who was

moving to Marquardt Village with her family's assistance. Moving day was frightening, tiring and filled with anxiety. As they were settling in, a family member noticed the worship schedule and said, "Grandma, there is a St. Mark's service here on Wednesday!" The knowledge that she would see her pastor in a few days made a world of difference.

Although the present chapel has served us well, renovations and upgrades are desperately needed for both the physical facility and the 30-year old broadcast technology.

Fortunately there are enough funds raised to complete the roof work before winter. But an additional \$80,000 is needed to make the other improvements a reality. Will you consider a gift to the Preserving the Past...Embracing the Future campaign for the Marquardt Village Chapel?

The current sound system is 30 years old. An improved system will provide better sound quality and sharper video images for the enjoyment of residents who are not able to attend in person.

While sunlight streaming into the chapel is usually a welcome sight, placing stained glass panels over existing windows will eliminate the blinding light that often shines directly in the eyes of attendees.

The interior of the Chapel will also be updated to include painting the ceiling beams. The wooden doors will be replaced with etched glass doors, for residents' safety, and to allow people to see there is a program underway without disturbing attendees. Lighting will be greatly improved through the installation of energy efficient fixtures and bulbs.

What’s a continuum of care? Simply put, it means we provide everything you need to live safely and securely, with peace of mind that your future physical needs can be met at Marquardt Village. We provide emotional and spiritual support as well, in the form of wellness and activity programs, meals, Chapel services, and support services such as

housekeeping, laundry and maintenance.

To help people think more about us when choosing a retirement community, we recently worked with a market research firm to conduct surveys and focus groups with seniors. The results showed Marquardt Village is the best kept secret in Watertown and the surrounding communities! Another result of the findings was our decision to embark on a series of steps to rebrand Marquardt Village and help increase awareness area-wide. You’ll notice changes in our logo, brochures and other materials that help communicate our mission, ideals and breadth of services.

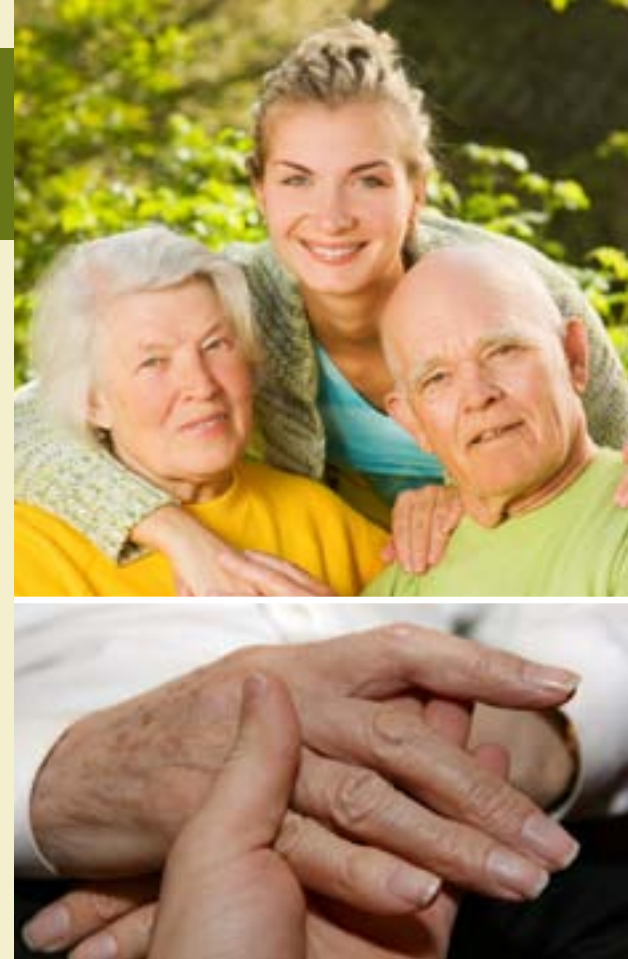
PREVENTING FALLS

Wisconsin's rate of death from falls has increased over the past 10 years. Among persons 65 and older, 67.2% of unintentional injury deaths are fall related, according to the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services.

Figuring out how to prevent falls or the reasons for falling is a complex process, which is one reason Marquardt Village Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) began offering Stepping On, a program based on the latest research in falls prevention. Together with various community partners (Aurora Pharmacy, Watertown Police Department, and others), HCBS now educates participants in a weekly class that falls are not a natural consequence of aging. Falls can be prevented by knowing the risks and how to manage them. Along with informative lectures from guest speakers, physical therapists teach simple exercises that can reduce the risk of falling by improving participant strength and balance.

"In Watertown we have a great community of support. We are very fortunate to have community partners who volunteer their expertise to make this program effective for the older adults in our community," says Program Coordinator Cheryl Meyer, RN.

Serving Marquardt Village and the Community

Dealing with the life-limiting disease of a loved one is one of the most difficult things any of us will ever experience. What a difference it can make when the proper guidance, personal support and attention are given during this time. That is the reason behind Hospice – we believe this stage of a loved one's life should be handled with dignity, compassion and sensitivity.

The mission of Marquardt Hospice is to provide faith-based, compassionate care at the end of life. It is our goal to help make whatever time remains as peaceful and meaningful as possible by offering comfort care and specialized services for your loved one's physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

Hospice is a unique kind of care in that it's available for both the terminally ill and their families, and is provided wherever the patient calls home. It neither hastens nor prolongs life, but instead provides support for patients through pain and symptom

management and for families through counseling. Marquardt Hospice serves patients of all ages, income, faiths and ethnicities who have:

- An anticipated life expectancy of six months or less
- A treatment goal based on comfort rather than cure
- Any type of terminal illness, including heart and lung disease, cancer, dementia, neurological disease and other life-limiting conditions

Hospice coverage through Medicare and Medicaid provides benefits that pay for medications, equipment and supplies, physician services, nurses, social workers and other therapies related to the life-limiting illness. Most commercial insurances cover hospice care. No one is turned away due to inability to pay.

Q&A About the Importance of a Will

A will is your opportunity to direct how personal property will be distributed after your death. It allows you to extend your love to special people and organizations in your life. Through a will you can name an executor (personal representative) or create trusts to benefit family members and generally help avoid misunderstandings among heirs. Let your will be a witness to your devotion to Christ and His people by supporting your favorite ministries beyond your lifetime.

How can I provide for Marquardt or other charitable organizations?

You can designate in your will a specific amount of money, a percentage of your estate or the remainder of your estate (once other bequests, debts and taxes have been paid). The correct verbiage to use is:

I give, devise, and bequeath to the Marquardt Foundation, Inc., of Watertown, Wisconsin, a not-for-profit corporation, the sum of \$_____ (or percentage of the estate or description of property) to be used for the benefit of residents at Marquardt Village.

You may also consider naming Marquardt as a contingent beneficiary.

Why is it helpful for the Marquardt Foundation to know of my intentions?

We would like to recognize your commitment and show appreciation for your generosity by inviting you to membership in the Ochs Society. The Ochs Society recognizes those who have made a planned gift benefiting Marquardt upon their death. This may include bequests, insurance policies, charitable gift annuities or other planned gifts. News of your generosity may inspire other friends of Marquardt to consider a similar commitment. If you prefer, you may remain anonymous.

Will I have any input as to how my gift will be used?

Often donors choose to let the Foundation Board of Directors and staff determine how a gift will be used based on needs and priorities at the time the gift is received. However, Foundation staff is happy to meet with donors to explore gift options that have special meaning for them.

What if my financial situation changes or I change my mind?

Recognizing situations change, any bequest is revocable. It is advisable to review your will every 3-5 years or when your family changes in a way that would affect the distribution of assets. We value your support and will continue to work with you to insure your wishes are carried out.
